From the Desk of Our CEO

Dear Friends,

The phrase "a year to remember" is certainly applicable for 2020 and JHS is no exception. Why? This is the year that, despite the many challenges, we met increased demands with creative, innovative solutions. We could not have done it without your unwavering support, generosity and faith in us. I am proud to share that your lifesaving support made the following possible:

- Compassionate care was provided to 7,284 dogs and cats
- Pet help resources kept more than 3,800 families together
- Our pet food bank served a record 180,000 lbs of food
- Low-cost and free veterinary care was provided to 5,026 families

Despite the challenges presented amidst the COVID-19 crisis, JHS remained open and did not eliminate a single staff position.

Most importantly, 2020 was another no-kill year for the city of Jacksonville, with the community-wide save rate at 93% and a save rate for JHS of 94%! A few significant accomplishments our community made possible for Jacksonville shelters include:

- Support from many local veterinary offices and community members for our Kitten Krusader program, which helped lower the number of neonatal kittens coming to shelters
- Volunteers contributed more than 19.000 hours of service
- Foster parents stepped up to serve 2,041 pets including orphaned kittens and puppies
- Nearly 6,000 dogs and cats were adopted into loving homes
- Citizens helped JHS provide 557 spay/neuter surgeries for community cats to help control the feline population in our community



What's the secret to this success? YOU! Your generosity of time, talent, and gifts never cease to amaze us. Jacksonville is a lifesaving city thanks to you!

JHS is taking your example and sharing it throughout the state. With your support, we are continuing with our Florida Leaders in Lifesaving initiative to end the needless death of shelter pets at a state level. Stay tuned for more exciting updates this year.

We are grateful and inspired by your commitment to pets and the people who love them. We are excited to begin 2021 with you.


