PARTICIPATE IN A HOME TO HOME PROGRAM!

Some shelters, such as JHS, will offer a kennel for the weekend to fully vaccinated pets that have been spayed/neutered. Potential adopters will be able to meet your pet and decide if your pet would fit well into their home. At the end of the day you pick them up to go back home if they are not adopted. This prevent shelter stress for your pet and eliminates surrender fees for you!

ASK FRIENDS OR FAMILY IF THEY ARE INTERESTED!

- Pets are part of the family! Many times friends and family are already in love with your pet and pets can have a much easier transition in to the home of someone they are already know.
- Friends and family can also help share Facebook posts or recommend acquaintances that might be interested in your pet as well!

CHECK OUT THESE TIPS IF YOU ARE STRUGGLING!

- Make sure you are using positive language if there are any behavior or medical problems! Talk about solutions NOT personal frustrations.
- Get your pet up to date on medical such as vaccines and prevention!
- Re-evaluate any rehoming fee and consider offering the pet's toys, crates, carriers, or other related items to potential adopters.

MAKE AN APPOINTMENT WITH A SHELTER OR RESCUE!

- Most shelters are by appointment only because they need time to make room for your pet. Shelters that also accept strays can stay pretty crowded.
- Even the nicest shelters or rescues are not a natural environment for pets and it can be scary or stressful for them.

This should be a last resort for you and your pet.
